

The Scholarship

We are proud of the community spirit and traditions that remain with us long after finishing school. Although our ethos has always been inclusive, many boys who would thrive in Terenure College cannot attend because their family cannot afford to pay school fees.

Terenure PPU Scholarship Trust was established by the Past Pupils Union to organise a scholarship scheme for boys who would like to attend Terenure College but whose families don't have the means. It is registered with the Charities Regulator and has been granted Charitable Tax Exemption by the Revenue Commissioners.

We aim to offer scholarships to two first year pupils every year from September 2019, and to increase this number in future years. Scholarships will be for tuition fees for the full six years together with a contribution towards ancillary costs including school lunches, sports kit, excursions, etc.

By supporting our Changing Futures Scholarship Appeal you are sharing the opportunity to attend Terenure College with someone who would really benefit from it and who will in turn enhance the College community.

Eligibility

Candidates for the scholarship will be boys living within commuting distance of the School, and whose families have income of not more than 110% of the Minimum Essential Standard of Living Budgets published annually by the Vincentian Partnership for Social Justice. These income levels are not much more than is needed to pay for the bare essentials of life.

Selection criteria

Scholarships will be awarded to candidates who will benefit most from being part of the College community. Applicants are expected to be from families who are committed to education, have a record of sustained effort and good discipline at primary school, and have participated in extra-curricular activities. Applications will be considered by a selection committee made up of nominees of the PPU, the school board of management, the St Vincent de Paul, and an independent person with relevant experience.

Financial need

For the Changing Futures Scholarship to be sustainable we need to have enough donations received or committed to fund each scholarship before it is offered.

We estimate that providing each scholarship offered will cost approximately €40,000 over six years. This cost is made up of tuition fees, books, sports equipment and contributions towards school trips and excursions.

We are asking past pupils to commit to a monthly contribution of €21, which is €252 per year, for six years. Your donation can be grossed up to €362.50 by the Revenue Commissioners if you are a taxpayer and complete a Form CHY3 that we can provide. This is a small amount each month, but it will make a huge difference to the boys who benefit.
